What have we been learning? #beingstrategic

We've had an fabulous week nine! Here are some highlights in each subject area:

Reading: This week we practiced using our best fluency and accuracy when reading aloud. We all chose excerpts from Nasreen's Secret School or Rain School, and have practiced them for a recording we'll do next week! *Ask your child to share about his/her excerpt!

Writing: This week we continued to practice writing informative paragraphs (intro, focus statement, body, conclusion). We focused on two reading challenges and strategies we would use to overcome these challenges. *Ask your child to share what his/her reading challenges are and the strategies he or she will use to overcome them.

Math: We've continued to study the relationship between multiplication and division. We are becoming experts at using arrays and repeated groups to help us determine products, and break apart numbers to find the quotient. *Ask your child to share 0's and 1's multiplication facts!

Science & Social Studies: This week we continued learning all about matter with Ms. Hazelgrove! *Ask your child to share an important fact they learned about solids, liquids, or gases.


